## WAELTY SELECTED FOR **PROJECT INDIANA 2023 TRIP**

WWVREMC Apprentice Lineman Robert Waelty will be a member of the Project Indiana 2023 crew.

#### LOCATION

Peña Roja, Guatemala

#### TIMELINE AND TRAVEL DETAILS

The Indiana crew will fly out of Indianapolis on March 30. Once in Guatemala City, the team will travel approximately 12 hours by automobile (trucks and/or vans) to the project site.

Once in the village, the project crew will stay in the village school, where electricity is already available. The village residents are constructing restroom and shower facilities in advance of the crew's arrival.

#### **PROJECT DETAILS**

This is a line extension off a build completed by the Arkansas electric cooperatives a few years ago. The project will extend electricity to 26 additional homes using approximately 30 poles and about 3.75 total miles of line. The project begins at an elevation of approximately 11,000 ft. The home at the end of the line is atop a mountain peak at roughly 12,000 ft. At this point, crews do not anticipate wiring the inside of each home.

#### **CREW MEMBERS**

A 14-member crew has been selected to complete this project. The crew will contain a mix of Project Indiana veterans and individuals new to international electrification projects. Crew members were selected based on the skillsets necessary to efficiently complete the build.

Waelty is the third WWREMC line crew member to participate in Project Indiana. In 2017, Operations Manager Derrick Mullins traveled to El Zapotillo. In 2019, Line Foreman Clay Smith traveled to the village of San Jacinto. We are proud to have employees step up to volunteer for worthy projects like Project Indiana.
