
COOPERATIVE STUDENT ART CONTEST

Store batteries away from direct heat or anything that can catch fire.

Stop using a battery or device if you notice a strange odor, too much heat, a change in shape, leaking, or odd noises.

Do not put lithium-ion batteries in the trash. Always recycle the batteries or electric devices at a specified recycling location.
